There has already been lots of Garlic Mustard, Forget-me-nots and other species in flower here. Now, we are seeing splashes of colour from Ox-eye Daisies, red Poppies and Foxgloves.

Colour elsewhere in the garden is currently provided by lovely yellow Lupins, pink geraniums, red geums, bluey-purple Cerinthe (probably the most asked about flower in the garden), orange marigolds and lots more.
