We don't always look up, however if you do you will see the meadow growing on the roof of Hengistbury Head Visitor Centre. There are Poppies and Vipers Bugloss. Let us know if you see anything interesting.

The garden meadow has begun offering a beautiful variety of flowers. The Corn Marigold next to the brilliant blue of Cornflower, alongside Oxeye Daisies.

The Chamomile lawn is established and mixes with the scents of Lemon Balm, Thyme and Lavender. An area of aromatic plants is being established so that visitors walking around the pond will brush past and release the aromas.

The ancient Wheat, Flax and Goosefoot have shown signs of growth. It is very exciting to be reviving old and rare species of plants.

We have successfully grown the rare and protected Deptford Pink this year from seeds we gathered when we discovered it last year.

Enjoy the lovely weather. We are just off to water the garden!
