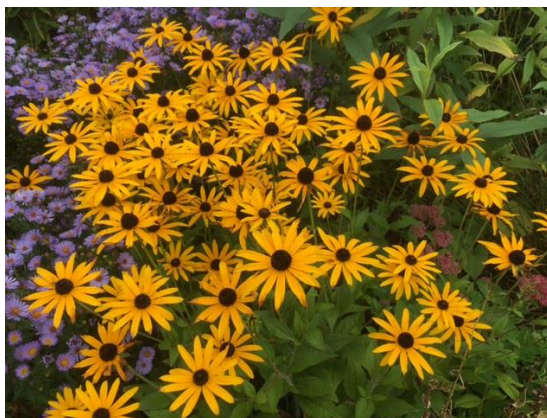


Garden Blog, Wednesday 20th September 2017

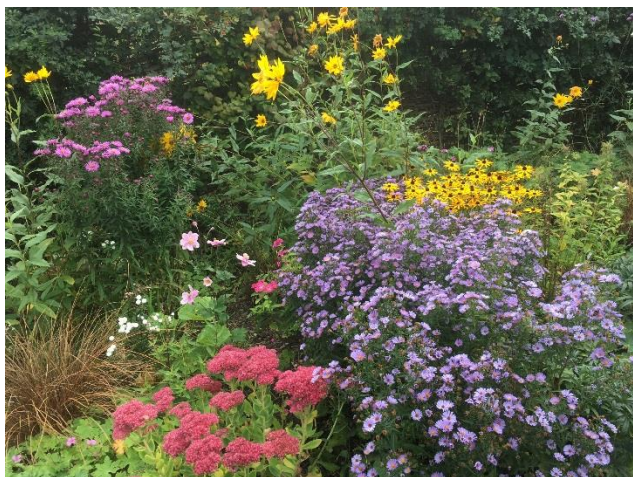


We are very excited about creating fibres from the ancient flax we have grown. We will let you know how it goes.
