



As you walk into the Hengistbury Head Wildlife Garden and look to the left of the arch there is a flower bed with a beautiful show.

You may recognise a deep orange Geum in front of pretty blue Forget-Me-Not. Lavender and Nigella contrast each other and the pink flowers of the Herb Robert. Behind and towards the fence the myriad of small lights purple flowers are the Dove's foot Cranesbill, Geranium family. Borage and a bright red Poppy flower is behind a Cow's Parsley. At the back the bright yellow Cat's Ear shines out. We are excited that many of these are self-seeded and native wildlife species.

Walking around you will also see Red Campion, Bladder Campion; The white one, along with many other uncultivated flowers. It is a joy to see such natural beauty.
