After the continuous rain of last Wednesday the garden has rewarded us with a riot of colour and amazing plants.

Many people ask about the Cerinthe which flourishes on poor soil and sunlight. The dark blues and greens contrast beautifully with the yellow Wild Lupins and there is a further splash of colour with the bright red Snapdragons.

Meanwhile, at the pond, the Yellow Flags and Blue Irises are looking splendid. There is also a splash of colour on the rockery with yellow Sedum, white Rockrose and pink Thrift.

It seems the Blue Tits have fledged, and it can happen in an hour.

Opposite the meadow is the perennial meadow where grasses mix with Foxgloves, Daisies and Poppies. With the new seating on the lawn, the garden can be enjoyed in the shade or the sunshine.
