

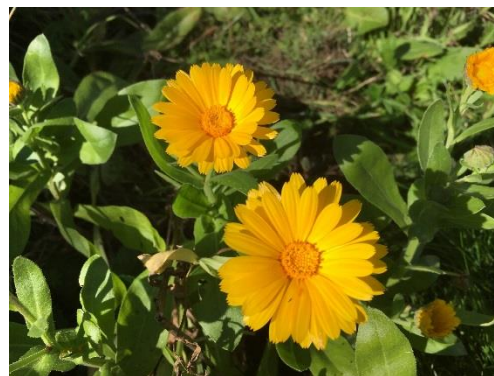
Wednesday 10th October 2018

What a wonderful morning! With temperatures of 20 degrees we are happy to say “Hello” to all the visitors sharing the garden with us today.



In the Sensory Area we are developing at the side of the pond, different Lavenders, Rosemary, Curry Plant and Lemon Balm are all establishing alongside the Chamomile Lawn. The Fennel Plant has seeds developing. The green seeds are fresh and aniseed in taste, while the drier brown seeds are great to add to sausage, pork and fish dishes.

Meanwhile we have been hard at work planting bulbs in the Meadow. They will flower before the Cornfield seeds that will be planted above. Such stony ground is an effort to dig but worth it.



A few months back a visitor saw a shrub in the garden here, near the Moth Trap. Having investigated and asked some plants people, it has been suggested that it is Germander. We will be watching for it flowering in the spring so we can identify more accurately.
