The sun is shining at this moment and one moment ago the strong wind brought a heavy shower. In between we have managed to plant bulbs in the meadow ready to come up in the spring. There are several varieties of daffodils from economy to native species such as Lobularis. In addition, there are Crocus and Iris to encourage insects.



We have added Sarcococca and Winter Honeysuckle for autumn and winter scent. For colour there is a new Midwinter Fire Dogwood and a Flowering Quince.

The Marigolds and Chrysanthemums are flashes of colour with the Rose Hips brightening up the hedges. This morning the pheasant came in foraging in the woodland. It was beautiful to see it up close.

The sun has finally come out again and we are glad that all our planting is well watered.
